# **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

## What is the Indigent Health Care (IHC) Program?

The IHC Program is a medical assistance program funded by a 1/8<sup>th</sup> of one percent of County Gross Receipts Tax and administered by the Board of County Commissioners who sit as the Indigent Hospital and County Health Care Board.

### How do I qualify?

### Residency

The claimant must be a Roosevelt County resident for a minimum of 90 days (three months) immediately prior to date of service. Proof of residency is required.

### **Income Limits**

Proof of income for 12 months immediately prior to date of service is required.

- Household of 1 \$12,000
- Household of 2 \$14,400
- Household of 3 \$15,600
- Household of 4 \$16,800
- Household of 5 \$18,000
- Household of 6 or more \$19,200 (max)

The IHC Program will not provide assistance to anyone who qualifies for Medicaid. Please inquire with the NM Income Support Division to determine if you qualify for Medicaid. A denial letter from the Medicaid office may be requested.

### How do I apply?

Applications are available at Roosevelt General Hospital or you may download your application here. A personal interview is required as part of the application process. Contact your provider to schedule an appointment. If you received services from an out-of-county hospital, please apply at the IHC Program office directly.

#### What medical services are covered?

Covered services include in-patient and out-patient hospital services and ambulance services.
