

## BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

## AN ORDINANCE

ESTABLISHING SALARIES FOR COUNTY  
ELECTED OFFICIALS;  
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS IN AND FOR THE  
COUNTY OF Roosevelt, STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1: TITLE AND AUTHORITY.--This ordinance may be cited as the  
"Roosevelt County Elected Officials Salary Ordinance"  
and is adopted pursuant to Section 4-37-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1975,  
Chapter 312) and Section 4-44- 5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1982, Chapter 39).

Section 2: DECLARATION OF PURPOSE.--Article X, Section 1 of the New  
Mexico Constitution requires the Legislature to classify counties and fix  
salaries for county officers. Sections 4-44-1 and 4-44-2 NMSA 1978  
classify counties and fix the procedure for notification to counties of  
this classification; Sections 4-44-4 through 4-44-12 and 4-44-14 NMSA 1978  
set the maximum salaries authorized by the Legislature for the variously  
classified counties.

It is therefore the purpose of this ordinance to establish salaries  
for elected county officers which do not exceed the maximum salaries  
established by law.

Section 3: SALARIES.--The following annual salaries are established  
for the year beginning January 1, 1983, and all years following, unless

changes are made by law that would require an amendment of this ordinance.

- A. Commissioners: (3) \$22,800.
- B. Treasurer: \$22,800.
- C. Assessor: \$22,800.
- D. Sheriff: \$23,800.
- E. Clerk: \$22,800.
- F. Probate Judge: 5,300.
- G. Surveyor:

Section 4: DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY; EFFECTIVE DATE.--This ordinance is necessary to establish salaries for county officers whose terms of office begin January 1, 1983; and there is an immediate danger to the public health, safety, and welfare requiring its passage without regard to the publication requirements of Section 4-37-7 NMSA 1978. This County Elected Officials Salary Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, and shall govern salaries for county elected officials whose terms begin January 1, 1983.

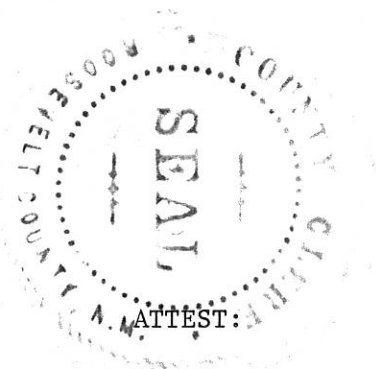

Elected "H" Class officials, except probate judge, in addition to the salaries above prescribed shall be entitled to receive per diem expense of not more than \$15.00 while in actual attendance at county commission meetings or while engaged in performance of official duties. Expense allowance shall not exceed \$350.00 in any fiscal year. Such per diem expense shall be in addition to any allowance for sheriff's mileage or for out-of-county expenses allowed for all officials by law and shall be budgeted, paid and audited as provided by laws governing expenditures of county funds.

Chapter 39, Laws of 1982, provides for the Board of County Commissioners to set county elected officials salaries after January 1, 1983.

Attachment I is a sample ordinance that may be used to set elected officials salaries effective January 1, 1983.

Attachment II indicates county classifications and the maximum salaries authorized by Section 4-44-4 through 4-44-12 and 4-44-14 NMSA 1978.
