

**COUNTY OF ROOSEVELT, NEW MEXICO:
ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE 2021-01**

WHEREAS, The State of New Mexico rewrote the Conflict of Interest Act as the Governmental Conduct Act in 1993; and

WHEREAS, the Governmental Conduct Act applies to both county government and county elected officials, appointed officials and employees; and

WHEREAS, The Governmental Conduct Act contains specific investigative and enforcement mechanisms to ensure compliance; and

WHEREAS, The Governmental Conduct Act provides sufficient ethical safeguards for the citizens of Roosevelt County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Roosevelt County, that:

Section 1. Roosevelt County Ordinance Number 2021-01 is hereby repealed in its entirety.

EFFECTIVE DATE


